The Human Resources documentation, VCI Application Form, Staff CV's.\_\_SJCC's Revisit report 2012 - Section 4 Practical Placement Criteria B — "Students must be adequately supported and supervised while in placement. It was noted at the time that practices were visited on an annual basis by 2 registered persons, both of whom had a heavy work load"

#### Comments

Area of concern that this recommendation was not met. Furthermore, remote communication has since been discontinued so the work load has increased. Pastoral support during placement is not consistently provided to all students. No recognition of hours spent on placement visits or calls.

#### Commendations

The staff are working additional (non-paid) hours in an attempt to cover this requirement, which adds a lot of strain on staff and easily could affect their welfare.

#### Recommendations

Previous recommendation in visit report 2012 (4b: Appointment of a further registered person for Practice Placement monitoring) has not been implemented. Programme requires action plan for inclusion of a designated placement officer or recognition of hours. This recommendation is considered a matter of urgency and should be implemented prior to next student intake in 2018
